## JOURNEY to the Cross: 40 days of discovery

We just celebrated Christmas and Epiphany and now we are preparing for Lent. Time goes by so quickly, doesn't it. Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 22nd) and ends with our Easter service on April 8th. I am so excited about our theme for this year: JOURNEY to the Cross: 40 days of discovery. The materials we have put together for our observation of Lent this year are intended to help everyone reflect more significantly on Christ's passion, as we use this special time for 1. Meditation, prayer and penitential practices. 2. Increase our understanding of Christ's sacrifice and Resurrection. 3. Renew our baptismal vows and recommit to the Christian life. These practices help us to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection victory on Easter Sunday. Such celebration becomes even more meaningful and rewarding when God's people set aside time in the weeks leading up to Easter to worship, study Scriptures, and think and pray about what Jesus has done for us, personalizing it in our hearts and lives.

The materials we have put together this year are meant to help all of us share the love and peace that flow from Jesus. They are meant to be encouraging, clear and personally meaningful.

This year, when we begin our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, you will be receiving:

- a **special Lenten cross** (to be worn during the season of Lent)
- A **Journey to the Cross adult prayer journal**, designed for daily use. This will help everyone to spend time in God's Word in the days leading up to Easter and to think more deeply about what Jesus did for us on the cross.
- **Teens and young adults will receive a Journey to the Cross faith experience journal** designed to help them encounter the crucified and risen Savior and then respond to that encounter in a variety of meaningful ways.
- From the pastors and vicar you will be receiving **inspiring sermons** designed to make our journey to the cross more meaningful. The theme of each week's sermon is listed below.

## From Words to Silence...

### Lift Up to God

Have you spent much time thinking about prayer? Maybe how to do it, who to pray for, what to say? Prayer is one way for us to communicate with God; to build our relationship with Jesus. We acknowledge His greatness, we thank Him for our blessings, we ask Him for forgiveness and we ask Him to intercede in our lives and others. Perhaps the hardest aspect of prayer, at least for me, is to just be in silence listening with Him. Prayer is powerful and it is something that brings us closer to God.

Beginning the first Sunday in February and continuing each Sunday through Easter you will have an opportunity to pray for an individual in our church community while another individual will pray for you... each day for one week (Monday to the following Sunday).

How will this work? When you enter the church on February 5 (and subsequent Sundays), you will be handed a sheet of paper. On one side you can write down your name (optional) and two-three prayer requests. The other side will have a short prayer written on it. That prayer will be said for you as well during the week.

When you go up to communion simply put your prayer request in the prayer basket. By doing this, you are deciding to pray for another person. After communion, the basket will be moved to the back of the church. Upon leaving, you take someone else's prayer request and pray for that person that week. In other words, put a sheet in and then take a sheet out. You are praying for someone and someone else is praying for you! The next Sunday it starts all over.

Prayer makes a difference in the history of other people's lives. Are you ready?

## News from Vicar John

Dear Bethlehem,

Warmest greetings in the name of our Savior, Jesus Christ. I pray this letter finds you all well this Christmas Season.

It's freezing here! Kelly and I forgot how cold it gets in the Midwest. After skipping "Winter" last year in sunny Jax Beach, we're not as used to ice and wind chill. Classes are going well this quarter. I'm taking a heavy load of credits in preparation for Rasmussen Baby Number Two (that's his name for now... we'll let you know his name once he arrives). This quarter I'm taking Pastor as Counselor, Biblical Theology, Sermon Structures, Man Woman in Christ, Psalms and Writings, and a lectionary translation class. Kelly is taking a class with me as well, since wives are allowed to audit one class per quarter. Once I complete this Winter quarter, I will only be taking nine credit hours in the Spring, which is the minimum amount of credits allowed for fulltime students. Next to having only a few classes left to fulfill for graduation, I figure the small load will allow me to help Kelly with the new baby, who is due January 29th. So far Kelly's pregnancy has gone really well. William knows that he has a baby brother on the way, but we're pretty sure he doesn't fully understand what this all means.

Kelly is still teaching an online class for Orange Lutheran in California. Outside of class I stay busy preaching once a month at Reliant Church, which is a church plant in the city started by our home church in St. Louis, Christ Memorial. I am also training for a marathon on April 15th. I'm hoping that I can keep up with my training during the cold months.

After much thought, prayer, and counsel, Kelly and I have decided not to stay for another year of graduate study. Now that I'll be eligible to take a call in the Spring, I've decided to leave myself open for placement. Kelly and I have had our interviews with the placement director already. I'm leaving myself open for team ministry, so I may have some interviews with churches this Winter, but I have a feeling I'll be placed as a sole pastor. We told the placement office that we'd like to go to the East Coast, West Coast, Southwest, or Florida. Only time will tell. Until May 1st (William's birthday and Call Day), we pray with excitement.

Bethlehem, we've had you in our thoughts a lot this year, not only because we deeply love you, but also because of the love that you've shown this year by meeting a large financial need. Every month when rent, utilities and health insurance come due, we're thankful that these expenses are paid in full instead of accumulated as debt. Many of my colleagues at seminary do not have this peace of mind. I consider myself very blessed! As we take call this Spring, we do so without the fear of large debt payments. A new child, a new church, a new city to call home... all these are blessings, but also stressful. Thank you, Bethlehem, for your very generous gift, which removes money from the list of those stressful items!

As the year continues, we will be sure to update you on our new child, as well as where we will be serving the Lord in the future. Please keep us in your prayers as we go through the placement process!
